

## CONFIDENTIAL BRIEFING: TRAVELLING SEX OFFENDERS

On the 21 and 22 February 2007, the Virtual Global Taskforce is holding its second annual conference at the Renaissance Mayflower Hotel in Washington D.C. In addition to the main conference presentations, there will be a confidential briefing for selected delegates on international risk assessments and risk management strategies for travelling sex offenders - i.e. child sex offenders who travel overseas to sexually abuse children.

### TOPIC

The briefing will:

- provide a more in depth understanding of offenders;
- draw on the latest available research;
- feature case studies and interviews with Western offenders who have been convicted of child sex offences overseas; and
- examine how specific factors, such as "celebrity", can impact on risk assessments and risk management strategies.

### SELECTED DELEGATES

This briefing is open only to the following delegates:

- law enforcement and others who conduct investigations where the sexual abuse of children is a factor;
- those who are responsible for managing offenders in the community; and
- those who have responsibility for protecting children from sexual predators. This includes those in industry with responsibility for safeguarding children and officials and advisers responsible for child protection policy.

**No media or media representatives will be allowed.**

All attendees will be required to sign a confidentiality agreement which prohibits delegates from disclosing the briefing content without prior written permission from the Child Exploitation and Online Protection Centre.
